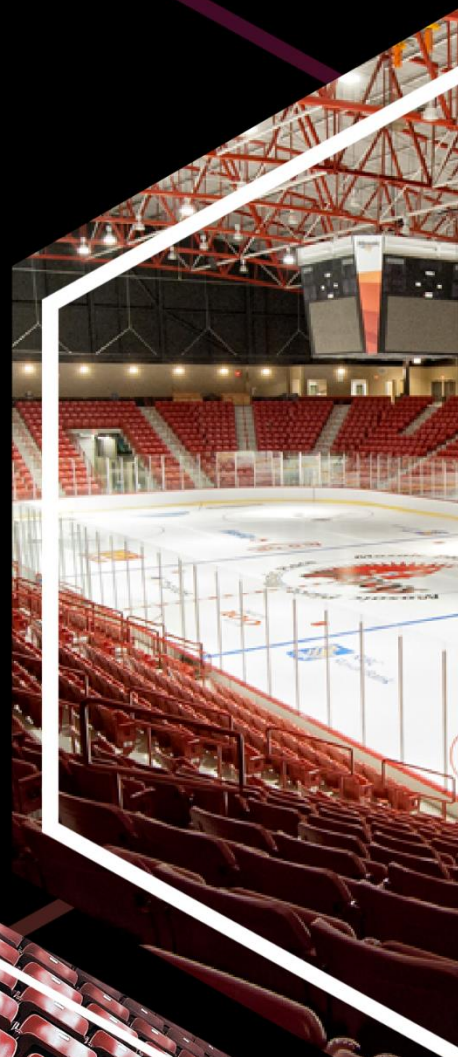

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COVID-19 RETURN TO PLAY PROTOCOLS

As we prepare to open Mosaic Place and allow access to skate (Oct. 9) we are working diligently to create a safe reopen plan with guidance from the Saskatchewan Government which includes several new safety measures for staff and customers. Since many of these measures will be new and will evolve, we want to be sure our guests are aware of these changes.

All staff and management will be provided return-to-play guidelines. It is the responsibility of the venue to ensure that rules and guidelines are in place and made available to staff and guests prior to entering the venue. Any changes from the Saskatchewan Health Authority Guidelines re-open guidelines will be reviewed and applied to the venue re-open plan.

GUEST SAFETY

Enhanced health and safety measures have been taken for guests, users, and staff of Mosaic Place. All posted instructions must be adhered to when visiting Mosaic Place and all City of Moose Jaw Facilities. Help Saskatchewan flatten the curve by staying home if you are sick. All standard COVID-19 protocols will apply in Mosaic Place.

RETURN TO PLAY

- Each user group must establish a return to play plan for how to minimize physical contact and the risk of COVID-19 transmission between participants, spectators, and officials.
- Plans must be submitted to Mosaic Place for review and approval.
- Players whose activities involve being within two metres of other players should self-monitor.

SPECTRA STAFF

- All Spectra staff will perform a self-assessment for COVID-19 symptoms prior to entering the venue.
- Spectra staff will not enter the venue if experiencing any COVID-19 related symptoms, or if they have been in contact with anyone who may have been exposed to the virus.

- Spectra staff are required to wear masks when dealing with guests in the building.
- Any case of COVID -19 will be reported with Spectra and Spectra will cooperate with the Saskatchewan Health Authority.

CAPACITY

- Any capacity dictated by the Saskatchewan Health Authority must be up to date, posted and enforced.
- **CURRENTLY IT IS PERMITTED** to have up to **30 PARTICIPANTS** taking part on the ice surface including coaches and approximately 30 spectators in a controlled area.

COVID SAFETY CHECK

By entering the building, you and your family are confirming the following:

1. I do not have any unexplained, new, or worsening symptoms (of any severity) that may include one or more of the following: cough, runny nose, sore throat, flu like symptoms, shortness of breath, muscle aches or joint pains, fatigue, or fever (38 C or 100.4 F).
2. I have not travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days.
3. I do not have a positive test for COVID-19.
4. I have not been exposed to someone who is under testing for COVID-19 or has been confirmed to having COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
5. I will maintain 2 metres of physical distancing.

SAFETY

- Signage will be placed outside and on the door entrance to remind all people of COVID-free criteria to be met to enter facilities for themselves and their family members.
- Parents and caregivers must assess their child daily for symptoms of the common cold, influenza, COVID-19 or other infectious respiratory diseases before sending them to participate.
- Entering the building is a declaration of health.
- If a participant is observed to have COVID-19 symptoms staff will refuse to allow the person further access to the building and ask them to leave the building immediately by the appropriate exit.

- If a patron develops COVID-19 symptoms during their rental, they must be moved to the isolation room (meeting room) and a deep clean will be performed by staff.
- Once the patron has left the building, staff must disinfect any surfaces and areas that the patron may have touched or been in contact with.
- If the individual refuses to leave or is in distress, staff will call 911 and Police and/or EMS will be dispatched to assist.
- Please respect your fellow teammates, skaters and/or spectators. If you are sick stay home.
- Keep your hands clean. Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Adequate hand sanitizer must be made available to guests at Mosaic Place.
- Avoid touching your eyes, mouth, and nose.
- Avoid touching hard surfaces people touch as much as possible.
- Maintain physical distancing (six feet/two metres apart).
- If you are unable to maintain 6ft of social distancing a mask should be worn.
- As a guest limit your time in the facility and maintain physical distancing when returning to your vehicle.
- Contactless payment is preferred.
- Organizers must keep a record of attendees. All players, spectators, staff and volunteers should be provided with a sign-in upon arrival option with name, phone number and/or email to facilitate contact tracing. Records must be retained for one month.

SAFETY CAPTAIN

- Each user group will have a self declared Safety Captain.
- The Safety Captain will become familiar with the protocols put in place for Mosaic Place.
- The Safety Captain will ensure that a record of attendance is in place if contact tracing is to occur.
- The Safety Captain is responsible for monitoring the capacity and ensuring that their group is abiding by the rules.
- The Safety Captain will champion the safety protocols for their user group.

SPECTATORS

- 1 parent or guardian may accompany a youth participant.
- Parents or guardians may stay and watch their participant in the dedicated viewing area. The spectator viewing area is only **SECTION V** of the arena bowl.
- Must follow the One way directions signage.
- Gatherings of spectators is discouraged.

- Spectators must maintain distancing of at least 2 metres from other members of the public.
- Spectators (excluding parents and guardians where necessary for player support) should be kept out of participant spaces.
- Small children accompanying guardians is permitted in the spectator area. Please keep children seating with guardian and supervised at all times

FIRST AID

- If a person becomes ill, they must immediately stop participating and return home.
- Try to limit the number of individuals in contact with the ill person.
- Place a mask over the individual's mouth and nose if they are not able to do so. Maintain a safe distance until the mask is in place.
- First aid providers caring for people should follow standard precautions. Those who provide direct care requiring close or direct contact should wear a mask.
- Following care, first aid providers should discard the mask and gloves following standard procedures and perform hand hygiene.

CLEANING AND SANITIZING

- A full building clean will take place prior to opening.
- A high touch surface disinfectant run will be created specifically for the arena and dressing room area and will be performed by the Mosaic Place House Keeping and Operations staff.
- Adequate soap and paper towels will be made available in washrooms. Hand sanitizing dispensers are not to be empty at any time.
- Hand sanitizing stations are placed in high touch areas and upon entry or exit of main areas.

SIGNAGE PLAN

- Signage will be placed in all locations to remind members of physical distancing and hygiene protocol.
- Clear entrance and exits signs will be posted.
- Handwashing reminders will be posted.
- Directional traffic signs will be placed to control traffic.
- Markers will be placed in areas as visible queues to encourage physical distancing.

TIME AND SCHEDULE

- As per contracted date/times.
- Groups may arrive 15 minutes prior to their scheduled ice time.
- Groups will vacate the dressing rooms within 15 minutes or less of their ice time ending.
- Avoid loitering in common areas and limit your time inside the venue.

VENUE ACCESS

- Face masks are strongly recommended when entering, changing, and exiting the venue or when social distancing of 6 ft is not possible.
- Please be courteous of Spectra staff and of other ice users. We are all in this together.

ENTERING THE VENUE

- All ice rental users will be required to enter at the North entrance located in the parking lot along High Street.
- Your team or organization will need to designate a Safety Captain. The Safety Captain will be met by a Spectra Staff member 20 minutes prior to your scheduled ice rental time.
- The designated entrance doorway will be clearly marked.
- Sign in with your groups Safety Captain and proceed to your assigned dressing room if one is identified and or provided.
- One-way flow of traffic is to be maintained whenever possible.

EXITING THE VENUE

- Ice Users and Spectators will exit through the same North Vomitory, but different doors. Again, being mindful to use the doors marked clearly for exit purposes.
- One-way flow of traffic to be maintained whenever possible.

DRESSING ROOMS

- Dressing rooms will be limited to 7 people per dressing room.
- Parents of skaters are to minimize time in dressing rooms as much as possible. If social distancing can not be maintained a mask should be worn.
- Additional seating may be placed in hallways.
- Please, when possible, arrive to the venue ready to play.
- Markers will be placed for designated changing areas to maintain physical distancing.
- Showers may be available.
- Dressing room ice access will be posted - please watch for signage.
- Off Ice warm up will only be permitted outside of venue.

ON-ICE ACTIVITY

- On Ice Activities must meet all current Saskatchewan Government and Sport Governing bodies Return to Play COVID-19 Guidelines and Recommendations.
- Any changes to on ice activities must be detailed in an updated Safety Plan and align with governing bodies adjustments.
- Maximum number of on ice participants will be limited to 30 (inclusive of coaches).
- User groups must follow the Competition and Game Play Guidelines as established by Public Health including the 50-person maximum mini-league guidelines.
- Tournaments and interprovincial competition are not permitted.
- **SPITTING** and other similar activities increase the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and are **NOT PERMITTED**. Sport contact must be minimized whenever possible.
- Congratulatory gestures such as high fives and handshakes are not permitted.
- Hand hygiene should be performed prior to play, and when possible, when contacting shared equipment through the duration of the activity; as well as at the end of the activity.
- All frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected prior to a new group being provided access to the arena. This will need to be conducted by user groups and staff.
- Players benches are not available for use, at this time, during “skills and drills” activities, public skating and non-game usage.
- If your ice group would like to use the benches during game play, please ensure the Mosaic Place Ice Coordinator is aware so the area is scheduled for a disinfectant run.
- One person is permitted in score keeper’s box at a time. Area must be wiped down before and after usage with provided equipment.
- Public Skating/Shinny will be limited to 25 people. All users must pre-register.
- Rush ice bookings are not accepted until further notice.
- No sharing of equipment is permitted. There will be no skate aids provided for public skating.

CONCOURSE

The concourse level of the arena **IS CLOSED** to public use at this time including bathrooms.

FOOD & BEVERAGE

- Outside Food & Beverage is not permitted at this time
- A water bottle for personal use is permitted and must be labelled with your name and not shared.



- Water fountains will remain closed at this time.
